Learn about the thousands-of-years-old practice of composting from an Indigenous community in Arizona.

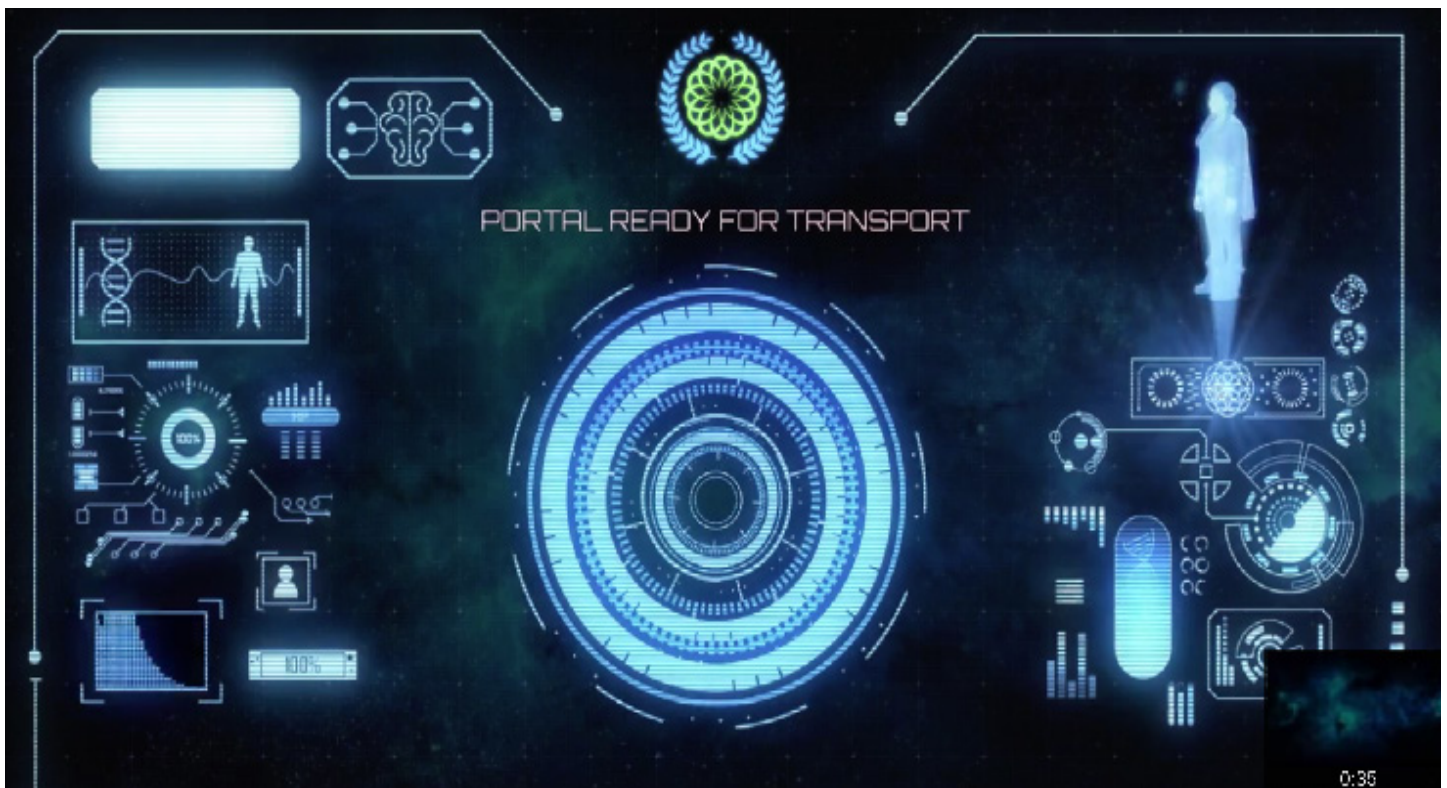
Episode 7
